ROOTS...A Look Back Through MRYC's History

THIS COLUMN EACH MONTH WILL LOOK BACK TO THE FUTURE -- THE PEOPLE, PLACES AND EVENTS THROUGH MRYC'S 120-YEAR HISTORY. YOU'LL SEE THAT SOME THINGS HAVE CHANGED... WHILE OTHER THINGS HAVE REMAINED QUITE THE SAME:

Our Home on the River— A promise of permanency (Part 1)

Number "405" Riverview Lane was not always our home base. While it appears MRYC functioned without quarters its first season, 1900, our very first clubhouse didn't come along until the next year. In fact, this original "clubhouse" was a former wheelhouse for cyclists and ice cream parlor, called "Wheelman's Rest." It was located about a fifth of a mile east of our present site, on the west side of the old iron and wood plank bridge to Point Pleasant and next to the current Bogan's Basin. A dock in front of the building was available to Club members. All for a lease of \$30 a year, plus a promise to paint the building! And so we had our first clubhouse in that 1901 summer season.

The small frame ice cream parlor was situated where once stood Brown's Inn, a large riverfront hotel built in 1890 and destroyed by fire sometime that decade. Brown's Inn was one of the many hotels that lined the Manasquan River in the late 1800s, all thriving with the arrival of train service to the area in the 1870s. In fact, train service in the late 19th/early 20th centuries was not much different from today—with six arrivals and departures daily between Brielle and New York, and a one-way commute of about two hours. One major difference was that following the trip, a bath and change of clothes were imperative.

A new location for the clubhouse came under discussion as early as December 1903, when a committee was appointed to explore expanding the ice cream parlor or finding another site. Several locations were considered, including ones to the east of the bridge and across the river in Point Pleasant. In June 1905, MRYC moved upriver, leasing a narrow strip of land immediately west of our current property, for \$75 a year for 3 years. The job of building a new clubhouse there was awarded to the lower of two bids, for \$895. Construction was completed in 1905, and the club and the Board decided to immediately pay off \$600 of the Club's \$900 indebtedness. MRYC now had a home, if not the land under it, of its own.

As further evidence of the promise of permanency, MRYC's Certificate of Incorporation was officially recorded at the County Clerk's office that same year, in September 1905. This is the first record of the club's stated purpose, which was later incorporated in our Constitution and remains there today: "The purposes for which the corporation is formed are to promote yachting and other sports on the Manasquan River (and adjacent waters) and to provide social entertainment for the members."

So how did we get from there to "405 Riverview Lane"? To be continued next month...

Dock & Harbor Winter Update

We are 100% complete with dredging and this project has increased our harbors water depth to 6 feet below mean low tide. The access channel to the river has been dredged and widen. We do not anticipate needing to dredge for the next +/- 12 years. This was a massive undertaking and the State contractors are continuing their work up river towards Clarks Landing. In the end 15 pilings had to be removed from the our east and west docks. The pilings with worm holes will be reinserted upside down so we will have to reposition those cleats, tide slides, ropes holders, etc. At this point we do not have a date for this work to be performed by marine contractor Kramer & Sons . Additionally, our four sections of floating dock will be reinstalled and the aluminum ramps power washed.

The 18 Northcoast had the steering upgraded to hydraulic and all instructors boats have been winterized and shrink wrapped. We will purchasing new dock carts in 2022 as our current carts have exceed their useful life.

Both the 18' and Chawk patrol boats will return to the club next week having been docked at Garden State for the last month to patrol for the Pram races.

The golf cart had the suspension, all bushings, bearings and leaf springs replace plus reinforced the hitches.

As a reminder, anyone looking to be placed on the Slip Waiting List MUST be an Active member prior to requesting to be placed on the list.
